

Reflection

Afraid to Go This Far

She excused herself for having touched Jesus, not only because she considered herself unclean, but because she knew that, according to the rules of that time, after her touch Jesus, too, would be unclean for a week.

This woman was always restricted because of her bleeding. She was desperate about it, and in her desperation, she did the forbidden thing: She touched him. And she was healed.

Instead of whooping and shouting with joy, she tried to get away as quickly as possible. He called her back. She approached him in fear and trembling: "Forgive me for wanting to be healed; forgive me for being a woman; forgive me for having touched you; forgive me for bothering you; forgive me for having made you unclean; forgive me; forgive me!"

He only said: "My daughter, your faith has restored you to health. Go in peace."

Not a word was heard about that old law. No step was taken because of his legal defilement. Not a word, not one word!

The impact reached much further than just this healing. It meant a total changeover, a miracle in the moral and legal order. Even today, we are afraid to go this far, afraid to admit that in all we do, and in all we don't do, we are equal in everything, notwithstanding the difference that makes our equality fruitful.


Secular Order of Discalced Carmelites
