Readings for March 13, 2022 Second Sunday of Lent

Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Psalm 27:1, 7-8, 8-9, 13-14

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Reflection

In this week's gospel, Jesus directly interfaces with evil, experiencing temptation, and responds to it. He is not "above" it. In the second reading, Paul invites all people to engage in their own salvation by using words and speaking aloud, as Jesus spoke aloud to dismiss the devil.

Whose Will You Be?

Whenever we start feeling too empty inside, we stick our pacifiers into our mouths and suck for all we are worth. They do not nourish us, but at least they plug the hole.

To enter the wilderness is to leave them behind, and nothing is too small to give up. Even a chocolate bar will do. For forty days, simply pay attention to how often your mind travels in that direction. Ask yourself why it happens when it happens. What is going on when you start craving a Mars bar? Are you hungry? Well, what is wrong with being hungry? Are you I onely? What is so bad about being alone? Try sitting with the feeling instead of fixing it and see what you find out.

Chances are you will hear a voice in your head that keeps warning you what will happen if you give up your pacifier. "You'll starve. You'll go nuts. You won't be you anymore." If that does not work, the voice will move to level two: "That's not a pacifier. That's a power tool. Can't you tell the difference?" If you do not fall for that one, there is always level three: "If God really loves you, you can do whatever you want. Why waste your time on this dumb exercise?"

If you do not know whom that voice belongs to, read Luke's story again. Then tell the devil to get lost and decide what you will do for Lent. Better yet, decide whose you will be. Worship the Lord your God and serve no one else. Expect great things, from God and from yourself. Believe that everything is possible. Why should any of us settle for less?



Year to Date (YTD) Income Comparison: Actual versus Budget Total Incomes for FY22 YTD Period


