Reflection

What does it mean that the first act of the Holy Spirit after being made manifest to the apostles is the gift of tongues? This should inform our call to personal ministry. No matter what our gifts are, whether they be words, presence, or deeds, we should always remember that the primary work of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost is to get Christ's message out to everyone.

Looking for a Pentecost Moment

The closest I have ever come to a Pentecost moment was my experience at World Youth Day in 2011. I made the pilgrimage to Spain with friends and young adults from local parishes, many of us having never been outside the United States before. We were overwhelmed by how many young people we met from all over the world. They had flags to identify where they had traveled from and what countries they represented. The thing that struck me most was how we were able to communicate and connect with people even though we did not share a common language. The sole thing we all had in common was this encounter of being pilgrims on the journey and being guided by our faith in Christ.

It strikes me that Scripture does not simply say that the apostles spoke in new languages. It also says that they were understood. Episcopal minister Eric Law talks about two miracles at play in this story. The obvious one is the miracle of the tongue—that those who spoke were able to speak through the Holy Spirit in ways that others understood. However, a less obvious miracle is the gift of the ear—the miracle that the people who received the message may have understood it because of their faith.


I believe we need both miracles today. As we pray for our own Pentecost moments—moments that will bring together those of us who are different in so many ways let us be sure to pray not only for the miracle of the tongue but also for the gift of the ear. And maybe ask, as the "Prayer of St. Francis" does, for the desire to understand more than to be understood.


