

#### Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Aug 7, 2022

Just as you punished our adversaries, you glorified us whom you had summoned.

You also must be prepared.

#### Reflection

It is good to ensure the care and safety of our families and communities. Jesus emphasizes the necessity of worldly care when he calls us, over and over, to ensure basic necessities for the poor. However, this gospel is clear in its message, and Jesus does not shy away from being critical of a man who spent his time ensuring the accumulation of and ability to sustain his personal wealth. We have a tendency in the modern era to immediately extrapolate what this means for the distribution of wealth among nations and implications for economies. This is noble work, but try reading this gospel as a message for you, and only you. Start with your own life. We have such a tendency to get ahead of ourselves, especially when we work for the church. This week, allow the gospel to be a love letter of instruction to you.

#### **God Willing**

As the old joke has it, one way to make God laugh is to talk about your plans. But what kind of God would laugh at carefully made plans gone awry? Think of a storm forcing an outdoor wedding into a cramped indoor space. Or a pandemic that demolishes plans for all weddings, birthday parties, family reunions, and graduation ceremonies.

We need to make plans. Planning for retirement can help us financially and reduce the burden we place on our loved ones as we age. And estate planning often helps to avoid resentment among our heirs.

Our dilemma is neatly summarized in Ecclesiastes 11:4: "One who pays heed to the wind will never sow, / and one who watches the clouds will never reap." We're advised to just go for it, do the planting and make ourselves ready for the harvest.

But in all our planning we must take care not to imagine that we are in control. Just two words, "God willing," can prevent us from the smugness of the farmer in today's Gospel. He's not a fool for considering ways to store a bumper crop. But he would have been wise to consider other options: sharing it, providing for the poor and hungry.

We need the bracing insistence of Ecclesiastes that all our anxious toil is vanity. And we need the perspective we gain from listening to Jesus' admonition. We must be prepared to live with the knowledge that our hold on life is tenuous, and that God will one day call us to leave it all behind.






