## **Next Sunday's Readings**

## 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

Humble yourself and you will find favor with God.

Psalm 68:4-5, 6-7, 10-11

God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor.

Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a

You have approached Mount Zion and the city of the living God.

Luke 14:1, 7-14

Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, everyone who humbles himself will be exalted.

## Reflection

This part of the gospel is where Jesus lays out the reality of the kingdom of God: not everyone will make it. This feels counter-intuitive—that the same Jesus who goes in search of a lost sheep, and embraces the Prodigal Son, will tell evildoers to depart. However, there is a satisfaction in the agency we are granted in this week's gospel. We have the choice within our own hearts, and exemplified by our actions, to love others as Christ loves us, or to not. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." It is easy to desire to do good. It is far more challenging to put it into practice.

### This Way to Jerusalem

The last shall be first, and the first shall be last.

We have heard the phrase so often that it has become practically meaningless. We nod in agreement, presuming to be among the last who will one day be first. But today's Gospel challenges that presumption. What if I am among the first who is going to be last?

The question makes me so uncomfortable I want to push back.

Tell me this, Jesus: You say the door is locked and you're not going to open it. But didn't you just tell us to "knock and the door will be opened" (Luke 11:9)?

You say, Jesus, that you're not letting me in because you don't know where I'm from. But then you welcome all kinds of people from who knows where—strangers rolling in from the east, the west, the north, and the south. It doesn't seem to matter where *they* are from!

If I am honest, this Gospel passage makes me want to reflect no further, put down the readings, and get on with the day.

But I know I should sit with the discomfort. Doing so, I notice something: Jesus' words come while he is "making his way to Jerusalem." He is heading to his Passion. He is heading to his death. Jesus' caustic warning is not aimed at people but at presumption. It is not enough to hang out with Jesus, eating with him and listening to him.

Discipleship means following him to the very end—whether we fall at the front or the back of the line.


