By your perseverance you will secure your lives.

Reflection

If no one had ever introduced the idea of resurrection to you, would you believe we live after death? Resurrection is one of the most shocking and necessary beliefs of a Christian. The whole system hinges on this idea that we are worth more than this life, that there is an eternal joy, for which we condition ourselves here. We train ourselves for resurrection by loving others, putting others first, and seeking goodness in all things. Does the notion of life after death ever shock you or surprise you? Do you ever struggle to believe it?

A Priceless Answer

Over the past year, I've been a guest on several different podcasts. Every time, the interviewers assured me I could just relax and enjoy myself, that they wouldn't be lobbing any "gotcha" questions my way. All they wanted, they said, was to find out what I thought.

Clearly, none of these guys were Sadducees. The group of scribes who posed their \$64 question to Jesus—which of the seven brothers would this woman have to marry once everyone had died?—did not remotely care which brother it was. Theirs was not an honest question, arising from a genuine desire to know what Jesus thought. The Sadducees were famous for not believing in the resurrection of the dead, so why would they be concerned about a dead woman and her many dead husbands? Obviously, this was a "gotcha" question, intended to make Jesus look like a fool. The implication was: your theory about eternal life is WAY too complicated. Look at all the troublesome family ties that would have to be factored in. Come on!

But Jesus was not one to be trapped by crafty legalists. You may be very smart, he said, but what happens after death is something beyond your ability to comprehend. Our life in God is a beautiful, mysterious thing; trying to explain it in strictly human terms is impossible. So back off, you who would try to trick me. Before the world began, I was.

Gotcha.

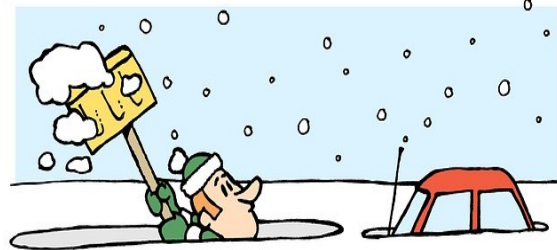

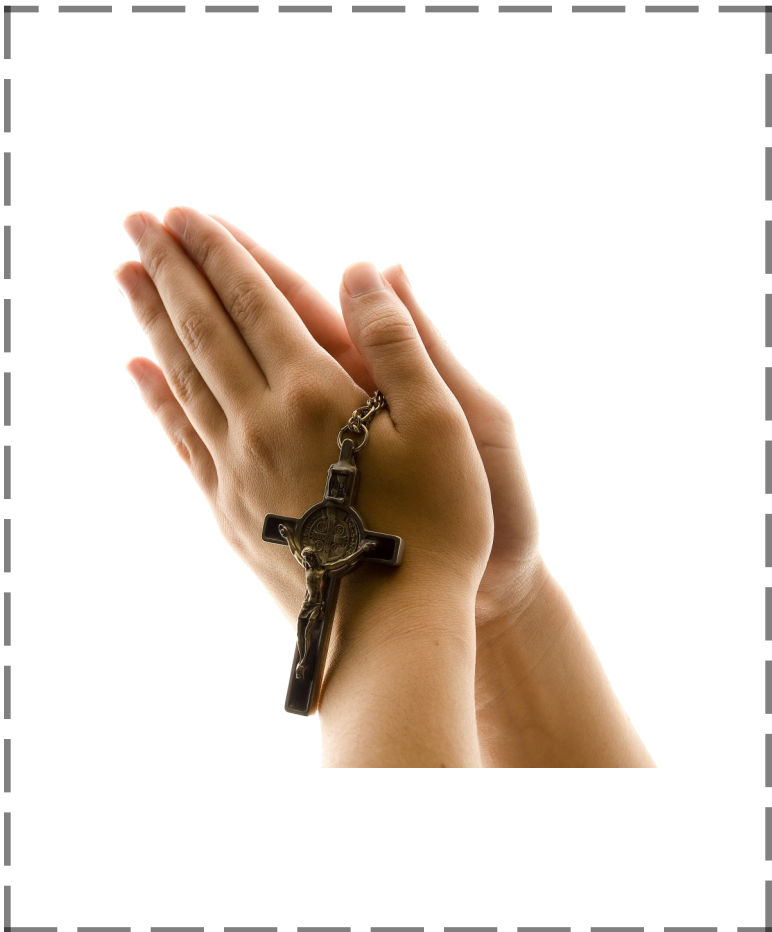

The work of these organizations includes improving existing food, financial, and health insecurities; access to mental health services; peer and family support for those living with mental illness; leadership development and organizing communities to address the needs of residents.

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

Below are highlights of the organizations within the Archdiocese of Anchorage-Juneau that have recently received funding from National and Local CCHD Grants:

Sitka Food Coop

The focus is to improve the existing food, financial, and health insecurities within the community by making wholesome foods and products available as inexpensively as possible. By bringing “Good Food & Community Together” the coop can also serve as a center for activities and services that will enrich the life of the community.



The CCHD grant has supported expansion of services of outreach and educational programs, which assists overall savings to people’s food budgets. Any profits are returned back to the community by supporting food banks. It is community owned and operated and many members are from the local parish and are involved in volunteering. When the Covid pandemic began, St. Gregory Nazianzen Catholic Church assisted us, so we could safely distribute over seven tons of food to our members.



National Alliance On Mental Illness (NAMI)

The focus is to help individuals impacted by mental health conditions build better lives through education, support, and public awareness. NAMI Alaska plays an essential role working to reduce stigma by promoting stories of recovery and resiliency, while identifying and nurturing peer leaders who can then address mental health disparities in their own communities. The mentally ill are among the poorest, most marginalized, and under-served population in the United States. In Alaska, especially in rural communities, access to mental health services is severely limited due to access, isolation from other communities and infrastructures, and high rates of poverty.

The CCHD grant helps to break the cycle of poverty and reaches out to rural Alaska. NAMI is steadfast in its commitment to raising awareness and working towards a time where all people affected by mental illness in our state are able to live healthy fulfilling lives supported by their families, their cultures, and a caring community.



Valley Interfaith Action (VIA) and Anchorage Faith And Action Congregations Together (AFACT)

VIA's and AFACT's missions are to address quality of life issues for all residents of the Mat-Su Borough and Anchorage, utilizing the faith values of our members to community, improve lives and mobilization for change.

CCHD grants have provided the opportunity to train leaders to address community problems through dialogue, research and working with ordinary people of faith who want to put their values into action. VIA and AFACT organize, empower and mobilize local faith communities to address quality of life issues affecting the community. Both are part of the state wide congregation based community organization, JOIN. The work of VIA and AFACT has included funding for the Pioneer Homes, housing, pedestrian safety, housing assistance, detox and affordable childcare. Their structure calls forth those in poverty, as well as others to participate in decisions that affect their lives, families, and communities in making positive changes in their communities.

During the Weekend of November 12th and 13th parishes will participate in the annual special collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).

These organizations have addressed poverty in areas such as improvement of existing food, financial, and health insecurities, help individuals impacted by mental health conditions build better lives through education, support, and public awareness; and address quality of life issues, utilizing faith values to build community, improve lives and mobilize for systemic change.

Currently 38 million people in the United States live in poverty. This collection supports those living in poverty across the country by funding programs that empower local communities to address the challenges they face. In addition, 25% of the funds we collect remain in our diocese to fund local anti-poverty projects. By supporting this collection, you are giving those on the margins a hand up, not a handout.
