

Reflection

If you hear the longer version of this gospel, Jesus makes clear what each seed is a metaphor for. Lack of understanding, lack of rooted-ness, and worldly anxiety can all prevent us from bearing fruit for Christ. If we are not deeply rooted, challenges can easily topple us. It takes constant weeding away of distractions and unimportant things to maintain space in our lives and hearts for God's word.

How to Thrive in the Waiting Place

In his classic book Oh, The Places You'll Go! Dr. Seuss describes "The Waiting Place," where folks are sitting around waiting "for a train to go or a bus to come, or a plane to go or the mail to come, or the rain to go or the phone to ring, or the snow to snow or waiting around for a Yes or No." I come back to these lines often and find them to be a simple but profound description of life. Truly so much of our passage on this earth is waiting—caught in the awkward space between what has been and what will be, involving the loss of what we have known and the fear of what has not arrived.

We spend our days in a perpetual advent season, a time of waiting. As St. Paul explains to the Romans, "all creation is groaning in labor pains." We catch the bus and board the plane and answer the phone in a state of pregnant expectation, awaiting the time when all will be fulfilled—when the suffering that stings us now will make sense against the backdrop of the glory to be revealed.

But waiting can be brutal, demanding more patience than we think we have. Its uncertainty is hard to tolerate at times, requiring a kind of faith and hope that is difficult to come by even for the most radical disciples among us. How, exactly, do we thrive in an indefinite advent when everything is half-baked and what seems very real to us is only half the story?

Jesus offers some instructions in today's parable: we sow our seed in rich soil. We regularly fortify our souls with the Word of God and its promise to us (not so much with the headlines in our news feeds or the trending social media stories). To exist calmly in a waiting place means to feed ourselves with real nutrients—with God's reassuring message that there is nothing half-baked about his love for us and his presence now, in this interim period. Although we may not have reached our final destination, there is significance in our journey, and there is value in the waiting.
